Fox Locks Preservation Fund

A designated spend-down fund.

The Fox River Navigational System Authority wishes to establish a charitable fund within the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region, Inc. (the "Foundation") and has provided for an irrevocable gift to establish this fund. This gift, together with any similarly directed gifts from any donor, shall be held and maintained as a component fund within the Foundation and administered as follows:

- 1. **Name of Fund**. This fund shall be known as the *Fox Locks Preservation Fund*.
- 2. **Fund Purpose**. This fund is established for the purpose of supporting the ongoing preservation and operation of the historic lock system of the Fox River Navigational System Authority.
- 3. Recipients of Fund Distributions. Distributions shall be made from this fund to Fox River Navigational System Authority, in Kaukauna, Wisconsin. In the event that Fox River Navigational System Authority, or any successor organizations, should cease to exist or to carry out a charitable purpose, distributions shall be made instead as directed by the Foundation's Board of Directors, in its sole discretion, to one or more organizations serving a charitable purpose similar to that of Fox River Navigational System Authority.
- 4. **Amounts Available for Distribution**. Distributions may be made in any amount, so long as a balance remains in the fund. This fund may be converted to a permanent endowment fund at any time, so long as the value of the fund assets at that time equals or exceeds the Foundation's then minimum endowment amount (currently \$10,000).
- 5. **Investment of Fund Assets**. The Foundation shall oversee the investment management of the fund assets. The Foundation's Board of Directors shall have all powers necessary or, in its sole discretion, desirable to fulfill this obligation, including but not limited to the power to retain, invest, and reinvest the fund assets and to commingle the fund assets with those of other funds for investment purposes.

6.	Obligation to Ensure Charitable Use of Fund. As a component fund of the
	Foundation, this fund is subject to the applicable provisions of the Internal
	Revenue Code and related Federal laws and regulations, to the laws of the
	State of Wisconsin, and to the provisions of the Foundation's Articles of
	Incorporation and Bylaws. These authorities require that the Foundation's
	Board of Directors, acting in its sole discretion, shall have the power and the
	duty to modify any restriction or condition of this fund that has become
	unnecessary, incapable of fulfillment, or inconsistent with the Foundation's
	charitable purposes or the needs of the community served by the
	Foundation.

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Memorandum of Understanding

In furtherance of its charitable purposes, the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region, Inc. (the "Foundation") will administer a charitable fund to receive tax-deductible charitable contributions from public donors for the benefit and use of the Fox River Navigational System Authority (the "Authority"). The Authority, with the administrative assistance of the Foundation, desires to use these assets to complete projects, as described in a separate executed fund agreement (attached).

The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding is to document the operating procedures of the partnership between the Foundation and the Authority, specific to a newly created designated fund (the "Fund") to support this work.

- <u>Fundraising</u>: The Authority is solely responsible for soliciting charitable contributions for the Fund. All fundraising must comply with the Foundation's *Fundraising Policy* (attached). All materials, including fundraising and marketing materials, that mention the Foundation or the Fund must be approved in advance by the Foundation. The Authority acknowledges receipt of the Foundation's *Fundraising Policy*.
- <u>Grant Applications</u>: It is agreed that any and all applications for grant funding and receipt of grant proceeds will be conducted separately from the Fund by the Authority. Applications will not utilize the Foundation's Nonprofit Employer Identification Number or the Fund, unless otherwise approved by the Foundation. Such applications may acknowledge the existence of this Fund, however.

<u>Contributions</u>: Checks should be payable to the Community Foundation with the Fund name designated on the memo line and sent directly to the Foundation. The Foundation can accept gifts via check, online credit card donations, transfer of securities, and complex gifts. The Foundation is currently assessed a fee of 2.598% plus \$0.26 per transaction. This amount will be deducted from online gifts. Pledged commitments are not anticipated to be accepted or tracked, unless mutually agreed upon by the Foundation and Authority in advance.

Subject to the Foundation's variance power, amounts contributed to the Fund will be used only to support the organization or project.

<u>Acknowledgement</u>: Charitable contributions and gifts that the Foundation receives for the
Fund will be reported as contributions to the Foundation, as required by law. The
Foundation agrees to acknowledge the receipt of any such charitable contributions or gifts
in writing to the donors and to inform the donors that the contribution received will benefit
the Fund's purpose.

- Tracking/Use of Funds: The Authority will provide the Foundation with the project descriptions and project names to use in recording donor designations for gifts. The Foundation will make note of any special designations made by donors, as applicable. The Authority will maintain records for each of its project(s). To ensure donor intentions are honored, the Authority also agrees to use any and all funds received for the specific purposes designated by donors. The Authority shall keep accurate and complete records with respect to its receipt and spending of the funds, and shall provide such reports to assist the Foundation in confirming application of donated funds, as requested. The Foundation handles the acknowledgements, donor records, fund accounting and distributions and prepare reports for the Authority, as requested.
- <u>Distributions</u>: Distributions from this Fund will be made to the Authority as grants through the Foundation's regular procedures. The Authority will appoint a representative to serve as the Fund Contact. The Fund Contact will be authorized to request distributions from the Fund in writing and to access fund activity online through the Foundation's Portal. Foundation staff can also provide additional details of fund activities.
- <u>Stewardship</u>: Donor stewardship (beyond contribution acknowledgement) and donor communication regarding use of contributions will be the sole responsibility of the Authority.
- Administrative Fee: The Fund shall be assessed an administrative fee of \$250 per month
 (\$3,000 annually) to cover the Foundation's administration for the Fund. This is a special fee
 arrangement. The administrative fee shall be reviewed annually to ensure alignment with
 the level of service, direct costs and staff time dedicated to administering the Fund. If
 deemed appropriate upon such review, the administrative fee may be amended by the
 Foundation in consultation with the Authority.
