Revision of 60% Design of Round Goby Barrier at Menasha Lock

Dear Mr. Ramlet:

In its regular meeting on October 25, 2022, the Fox River Navigational System Authority (FRNSA) Board of Directors approved the request for a proposal to update the 60 percent Design Package for the Menasha Lock Electric Barrier that was submitted to FRNSA by Smith-Root, Inc. in March 2019. The Board specifically asked for an update of 60% design drawings, 60% Operations and Maintenance (O&M) Manual, and a 60% Engineer's Opinion of Probable Construction Cost (OPCC) completed to approximately the Class 3 level per the Association for the Advancement of Cost Engineering International (AACE) Cost Estimate Classification System, often considered a budget authorization or feasibility-level cost estimate with an expected accuracy range from -20% to +30%.

The update to the 60% design package is intended to reflect the additional information that has been developed and discussed since the 2019 submittal with regards to details about electrical deterrence of Round Goby. Specifically, Round Goby swimming speeds and electrical field thresholds have been refined, and additional knowledge about Round Goby locomotion has been obtained. Encompassing this new information in the 60% design includes the expansion of the electrical field from a "benthic barrier" of the bottom 1-2 feet to the full water surface. The required length of the deterrent field was also more clearly defined, leading to a slight reduction in the overall barrier length. These details will be updated in the design drawings, OPCC, O&M Manual, and design report.

After the Board's approval and request for a proposal, Kleinschmidt attended a meeting with **Smith-Root, Inc.** on October 27 to discuss approaches for preparing the update to the barrier design. An outcome of this meeting, which included Smith-Root president Rick Crump, was

the agreement to assign Kleinschmidt as the lead engineer and prime consultant for the effort. As the designer and manufacturer of the electrical pulse generation equipment, Smith-Root has a key role on the team and will prepare deliverables as they relate to the electrical equipment. Smith-Root will also support and advise FRNSA on topics of human health and safety and boat equipment safety as a subconsultant to Kleinschmidt.

Two other engineering firms were instrumental in producing the original 60% design package. Aptum, Inc. (Aptum) conducted structural engineering of the 60% design and provided drafting services. Aptum was acquired in 2019 by **Parametrix**; Parametrix will serve the same role as Aptum in this effort. Similarly, site civil engineering design, not including the electric barrier, was conducted by OMNNI Associates (OMNNI) which was acquired by **Westwood Professional Services (Westwood)** in 2019. Westwood will continue the OMNNI role on the Kleinschmidt team for site civil engineering design.

A new company has been added to the team as a subconsultant. **Lunda Construction** will provide the marine-side construction cost estimate as requested by the FRNSA Board. The land-side construction cost estimate will be provided by other team members and integrated into a single cost estimate document.

The Smith-Root 2019 60% design submittal included drawings, O&M Manual, construction material specifications and a draft Electrical Field Simulation Report. This updated proposal includes updates to all these documents and adds two documents: a Class 3 OPCC and a Design Technical Memorandum in order to provide a complete record of design efforts to the 60% stage. A detailed scope of work with associated schedule and price proposal follows.

This version of the proposal updates the project delivery schedule; see Schedule section. No changes have been made to the Scope of Work or proposed price.

Proposed Scope of Work

Based on our understanding of the services requested of Kleinschmidt, we are proposing to provide the following services.

Task 1. Project Management and Kickoff Meeting

Task 1 will initiate with a 2-hour project kickoff virtual meeting between FRNSA and the Kleinschmidt team to introduce the team to each other and discuss the work scope, schedule, communication protocols, etc. FRNSA's preferred outcomes will be specifically discussed; these outcomes will be captured in the Kickoff Meeting notes and will be identified in the Design Criteria Document (Task 2).

This task will include facilitation of project workflow management, subconsultant contract management and billing, communications and coordination, and related tasks.

Task 2. Information Review and Design Basis Memorandum

The Kleinschmidt team will review existing information provided by FRNSA related to Menasha Lock and the Menasha Lock barrier design including but not limited to the 2019 design and O&M documentation, historical drawings, photographs, relevant studies and reports, etc. In addition, the team will acquire relevant publicly available information such as flow gauge information, water quality data as available, etc.

A technical memorandum will be developed that describes applicable design basis for the Menasha Lock barrier, including the deterrent elements of the Round Goby barrier. The technical memorandum will be submitted to FRNSA to be reviewed by the Board of Directors for concurrence. If necessary, one round of revisions will be made to the technical memorandum after a consolidated set of comments are received following the Board review.

Assumptions:

- All information that is input to the design criteria technical memorandum will be received by the Kleinschmidt team within two weeks of Notice to Proceed.

Deliverables:

- A brief draft design basis technical memorandum
- One revision to the draft design basis technical memorandum incorporating revisions as directed by FRNSA
- Final version of draft design basis memorandum

Task 3. Prepare 60% Design Documents

The Kleinschmidt team will prepare a new set of 60% design documents to include the following items:

- 60% design drawings, including in-water and "land side" modifications. Up to 20 sheets will be developed with civil/structural plan, profile, and cross sections of in-water and "land side" modifications. General building plans, elevations, and details will be developed for the new building that will house (at a minimum) the backup generator and new toilets. Mechanical and electrical drawings and details are not included in the 60% design;
- 60% specifications (may be included on the design drawings);
- 60% design technical memorandum;

- 60% Operation Manual;
- Draft Technical Memorandum describing the electrical field simulation;
- Letter report describing results of one sediment sample taken in the proposed vicinity of the electric barrier to evaluate potential contaminants; and
- Boater safety technical memorandum.

With the exception of the 60% design technical memorandum, the design package deliverables will roughly follow the format of the 2019 Menasha Lock barrier submittal to FRNSA, publicly available online at <https://foxlocks.org/menasha-lock/>. The objective of the deliverables is to provide the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) the information about barrier design and expected effectiveness needed to make a determination of the applicability of the proposed lock modifications for the Department's authority per the Invasive Species Rule (NR 40).

After receiving a consolidated set of comments from the review of the design documents by the FRNSA Board, Kleinschmidt will make revisions to design package elements prior to FRNSA submittal of the information to Wisconsin DNR.

Development of the 60% design package will be conducted by all members of the Kleinschmidt team; lead responsibility for each element of the package is shown in Table 1.

Assumptions:

- The Kleinschmidt team may use parts of the previous 60% design drawings and specifications (with permission from Smith-Root), but the majority of the design will be new.
- All information used in the 2019 60% design, including but not limited to ground and bathymetric contours/terrain and lock site layout, is current and applicable to the updated 60% design. All new information that FRNSA would like the Kleinschmidt team to consider will be furnished no later than one business day following the Kickoff Meeting. One exception to this assumption is water quality data from the Wisconsin DNR monitoring station 713002; up to date statistical analysis of relevant water quality parameters will be updated with recent data downloaded by Kleinschmidt.
- Technical specifications will be updated to reflect revisions to relevant municipal codes and design standards.
- The 60% Operation Manual will be developed with substantial input from FRNSA with the objective of integrating barrier operations with typical daily and annual lock operations.
- FRNSA will allow the Kleinschmidt team access to the site with up to one (1) week advance notice for sediment sampling, measurements, etc.
- The sediment sample will be collected in the winter when ice is sufficiently set up to allow access without a boat. The sediment sample will be collected with a handheld AMS sediment sampling tool, placed into laboratory-provided sample containers, placed immediately on ice, and transported to a local laboratory for analysis of polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), and metals (arsenic, barium, cadmium, chromium, copper, cyanide, iron, lead, manganese, mercury, nickel, selenium, and zinc). The sediment sample location will be surveyed with GPS equipment that will provide centimeter accuracy with adequate satellite coverage.
- The original 60% design included modification to an existing building and a new building that includes public restrooms and a backup generator enclosure. With anticipated increases to the required size of the building that will house the electrical pulse generating equipment, we anticipate increasing the size of the new building to accommodate the equipment and not modifying the existing building.

Deliverables:

- 60% design package as described above
- Revised 60% design package with one round of revisions incorporating comments as directed by FRNSA

Cost of Services

Kleinschmidt will perform the proposed work on an Hourly Rate plus Expenses basis for the estimated cost of **\$166,400** (One hundred sixty-six thousand four hundred dollars). The Cost of Services is calculated using Kleinschmidt's 2023 Standard Rates. Table 3 presents a breakdown of the hours we anticipate expending on the project for each phase of the proposed Scope of Work. The estimate is not a fixed price or an upper limit. We will not exceed the estimated amount without first discussing the need with you and receiving your authorization to proceed. Attachment A shows the hourly billing rates for 2023.

(A MAINE CORPORATION)
STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

1. **Purpose:** These Standard Terms and Conditions when combined with a Proposal are intended to form a complete Agreement between Kleinschmidt Associates (Kleinschmidt) and the Client to whom the Proposal is addressed. When Kleinschmidt's signed Proposal has been accepted by the Client, the resulting Agreement shall take the place of all other agreements and representations concerning the subject of the Proposal. This Agreement may be amended only by a writing signed by both parties. Terms and Conditions of any purchase order issued by Client shall not be part of this Agreement unless separately signed by Kleinschmidt.
2. **Payment:** In consideration for Kleinschmidt's performance of the proposed work, Client shall pay Kleinschmidt as stated in the Proposal. Client agrees to pay promptly Kleinschmidt's fees and expenses as submitted on monthly invoices. If any balance remains unpaid thirty days from the date of the invoice, Client shall pay interest on the unpaid balance at the rate of one and one-half percent per month from said thirtieth day and shall, in addition, pay Kleinschmidt's costs of collection including reasonable legal fees.
3. **Client's Duties:** At no cost to Kleinschmidt, Client shall:
 - Promptly provide to Kleinschmidt the information required by Kleinschmidt for performance of its services.
 - Provide Kleinschmidt personnel with access to the work site so that they may perform their work without interference.
 - Designate a Client's representative with authority to transmit instructions, receive information, and define Client's policies concerning this Agreement.
 - Promptly notify Kleinschmidt of any defect in Kleinschmidt's services as soon as Client becomes aware of it.
 - Prior to commencement of Kleinschmidt's work, furnish Kleinschmidt with any special design or construction standards, which Client may require Kleinschmidt to follow.
4. **Kleinschmidt's Liability:** Kleinschmidt's services will be performed with that degree of reasonable care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the same profession currently practicing under similar circumstances.
 - The total liability by Kleinschmidt and its agents for all claims relating to the work outlined in the Proposal shall not exceed the compensation received by Kleinschmidt or \$50,000, whichever is greater.
 - Kleinschmidt shall not be liable for any losses resulting from deficiencies in its services if those deficiencies arise from a cause beyond Kleinschmidt's reasonable control.
5. **Betterment:** If Kleinschmidt omits a required element of the project, Kleinschmidt shall not be responsible for paying the cost to add such item to the extent that it would have been necessary to the project or otherwise adds value or betterment. Kleinschmidt will not be responsible for any added cost or expense that provides betterment, upgrade or enhancement of the project.
6. **Shop Drawing Review:** When authorized by Client, Kleinschmidt shall review contractor submittals, such as shop drawings, product descriptions, samples, and other data, but only for determining that it conforms to the design concept and that it appears consistent with the contract documents. This shall not include checking the accuracy or completeness of details, such as quantities, dimensions, weights or gauges, fabrication processes, construction methods, coordination of the work with other trades, or construction safety issues, all of which are the sole responsibility of the Contractor.

Kleinschmidt's review shall be conducted with reasonable promptness while allowing sufficient time to permit a review that is adequate in Kleinschmidt's judgment. Review of a specific item does not mean that Kleinschmidt has reviewed the entire assembly of which the item is a part.

Kleinschmidt shall not be responsible for any deviation from the contract documents unless the deviation is brought specifically to Kleinschmidt's attention by the Contractor in writing. Kleinschmidt shall not be required to review partial submissions or those for which correlated items have not been received.

7. **Ownership of Documents:** Any drawings, specifications, or reports prepared by Kleinschmidt under this Agreement shall be the property of Client; however, Kleinschmidt shall have the unlimited right to use such drawings, specifications, and reports and the intellectual property therein. Client's use of such drawings, specifications, and reports shall be limited to the project or purpose for which they were prepared. Any use other than that purpose will be at Client's sole risk and without liability to Kleinschmidt and Client shall indemnify and hold harmless Kleinschmidt from all claims, damages, losses, and expenses resulting therefrom.
8. **Opinions of Probable Cost:** Opinions of Probable Cost prepared by Kleinschmidt are merely expressions of Kleinschmidt's judgment based on its experience as a design professional familiar with the industry. Kleinschmidt has no control over market prices, construction methods, or competitive conditions and therefore cannot represent that actual bids or negotiated prices will not vary from Kleinschmidt's Opinions of Probable Cost.
9. **Patents:** Kleinschmidt's work under this Agreement shall not include patent or copyright searches; and Kleinschmidt assumes no responsibility for any patent or copyright searches; and Kleinschmidt assumes no responsibility for any patent or copyright infringement that may arise from its work. Kleinschmidt makes no representation that anything made, used, or sold in connection with its services will be free from such infringement.
10. **Termination or Suspension:** Either party may terminate this Agreement upon reasonable notice to the other. Kleinschmidt shall be paid for the services provided and expenses incurred through the date of termination.

If the Agreement is terminated by the Client without breach by Kleinschmidt or if Kleinschmidt terminates for Client's breach, Kleinschmidt shall also be paid its reasonable and necessary termination costs which may include layoff and demobilization expenses as well as costs of terminating contracts, leases, and other obligations incurred by Kleinschmidt in reliance upon this Agreement. If Client suspends the work, Kleinschmidt shall be reimbursed by Client for such added fees and costs which arise from the suspension and remobilization.

Kleinschmidt shall not be liable to Client for losses resulting from Kleinschmidt's termination or suspension caused by Client's non-payment or other material breach of this Agreement.
11. **Assignment:** Neither party shall assign its rights, interests, or obligations under this Agreement without prior written consent from the other party; but such consent shall not unreasonably be withheld.
12. **No Waiver:** The failure of either party to enforce a provision of this Agreement shall not prevent that party from later enforcing it or from pursuing the remedies that may be available for breach of the provision.
13. **Indemnification:** Within its limit of liability Kleinschmidt shall indemnify and hold harmless the Client and its agents from any and all claims and losses caused solely by the negligent acts or omissions of Kleinschmidt or its agents in the performance of services under this Agreement.

Client shall indemnify and hold harmless Kleinschmidt and its agents from any and all claims and losses caused solely by the negligent acts or omissions of Client or its agents with respect to this Agreement.

14. **Governing Law:** This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Maine, provided that nothing contained in the Agreement shall be interpreted in such a way as to render the Agreement unenforceable under any law of the United States or the law of the place in which the Client is located.
15. **Time for Acceptance:** Kleinschmidt's proposal shall remain firm for no longer than 60 days unless another period is specified in the proposal or the time is specifically extended by Kleinschmidt.

3. For Lump Sum projects, Kleinschmidt will invoice monthly as a percent complete of the project or Work Authorization, unless otherwise defined in the Work Authorization.
4. For Time and Materials, or Hourly Rate projects, Kleinschmidt will invoice monthly for all employee time at the hourly billing rate currently in effect, times a number of hours worked on the project plus subconsultant fees and expenses as described below. Client agrees to pay for expert testimony and direct preparation for testimony in any litigation, arbitration, or other legal or administrative proceeding at 150% of the standard billing rates with a minimum daily charge based upon an 8-hour day, plus Reimbursable Expenses.
5. For any projects where expenses are invoiced separately from labor, the following apply:
 - a. Client agrees to pay Kleinschmidt a 15 percent markup for subconsultant services.
 - b. Client agrees to pay 3 percent of labor costs for telecommunications (e.g., phone, data transmission and storage, fax, conference and video conference, data security).
 - c. Client agrees to pay for specialized computer programs, field equipment, and other unit charges (e.g., photocopies, mileage, photos, drawing reproductions, CD preparation, SharePoint hosting) according to the current rates in effect.
 - d. Client agrees to pay any other reimbursable expenses actually incurred by Kleinschmidt at cost.

Each phase is representative of a particular project that we have worked on in the past month and is generally associated with a lock or group of locks. The time and fee for each project is then listed on the unbilled detail and the invoice. Also, for each phase, comments are typically noted for each time entry so we know what the time was for. The comments do not show up on the invoice but are generally on the "unbilled detail" report that we receive to review time and expenses. Lastly, on the unbilled detail report, the first column that is on the report is for "Billing Status". This is where we would normally indicate what should be invoiced, held or written off. If there is a W in the column, that time or expense would not show up on the invoice and would be written off so it does not show up on some future invoice. B in that column would indicate time to invoice and H would indicate time is being held for some reason.

A summary of what was worked on for each separate project on this invoice is as follows:

1. Phase 012 – Owner Representation - Time for Tim Bolwerk to prepare for and attend meetings with WDNR regarding dam inspection schedules and projects as well as to meet with WDNR and WE Energies regarding WE Energies electrical line relocation through the Appleton Canal/dam. Also had conference call with Jason Kent regarding Menasha electrical fish barrier and looking through documents from original preliminary design at Menasha Lock. Remaining time in this phase was spent on general project admin/management work associated with the various projects.
2. Phase 023 – Menasha Lock Transfer system – Bob Givens also had some time associated with discussions with Jason Kent on the electrical fish barrier at the Menasha Lock and document reviews associated with that discussion that were listed in this phase.
3. Phase 40 – Electrical Resistivity Study – Time for surveyors to go out and perform topographic surveys at the six locations where the electrical resistivity study was to be performed. Also, time for Tim Bolwerk and Kyle Weeks for coordination with Terracon and FRNSA on the ER work as well as the survey requirements.
