III. Buoy Project

- A. Presentation by Jeremy Cords
 - 1. Jeremy Cords led a committee of people from approximately 2014-2017 to work on placement/restationing/costs/etc of buoys for the Fox River
 - Approximately (255) buoys would be needed for proper navigational marking

 Coast Guard administered buoys until late 1970's



- b. Initial cost \$400K
 - i. Purchase buoy
 - ii. Program administration
 - 1. Thereafter buoy program expenses drop to roughly \$120K annually
 - 2. Funds to be sought from counties, municipalities, and WIDNR
- c. Appleton Yacht Club (AYC) currently administers some buoys
- 3. FRNSA would like counties to fund initial cost of buoys/tackle
- 4. Counties have authority to place buoys
 - a. Outagamie County
 - i. Roughly (150) buoys from Menasha through Rapide Croche
 - b. Brown County
 - c. Winnebago County
 - i. Winnebago Parks Department administers buoys
 - ii. Annual cost approximately \$80-100K
- 5. Funding
 - a. FRNSA is not responsible for buoys along the entire river.
 - i. FRNSA is responsible for portion of river inside government canals
 - ii. FRNSA is in the navigational business and wants use of the river to be done safely
 - b. Board thinks a buoy program is necessary and recommends moving forward
 - i. Phil Ramlet will reach out to Fox Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau (FCCVB)
 - ii. Ashley Dooley will check what options the WIDNR has available for funding a buoy project
 - iii. Reach out to share concept and "sell" to counties
 - iv. Phil Ramlet will report back in May or June 2024
 - 1. Implementation goal is 2025
- 6. Reasons to Proceed
 - a. Better system and more portages would draw more kayakers
 - b. Dramatic need for markers (Steve Erb-AYC)
 - i. Unmarked hazards in river
 - ii. Boulders beneath surface
 - iii. Suggests part of scope include educational/reminder signage on how to use buoys
 - iv. Should use a barge for safely placing buoys
 - This portion of the buoy project would be contracted to Radtke Contractors or McMullen & Pitz Construction Company



- c. River is like a highway, users depend on "signs" to travel safely

 - 1. Market has been "flat"
 - 2. Nothing significant for January 2024
 - 3. Funds down\$140K
 - 4. Operations Expenses well above budget of \$20K
 - a. Liability Insurance \$53K
 - i. Fiscal year budget is \$65K
 - ii. Year-to-Date FRNSA has spent \$80K on liability insurance
 - 1. Recommended that Phil Ramlet look into these charges to confirm accuracy and why such a discrepancy between actual and budget
 - b. Audit fees
 - i. \$10K, as budgeted
 - 5. Capital Expenses
 - a. UWGB study \$8.9K
 - i. Fiscal year budget is \$36K
 - ii. Year-to-date FRNSA has spent \$51K
 - b. Goby study \$10.3K
 - i. Fiscal year budget is \$15K
 - ii. Year-to-Date FRNSA has spent \$147K
 - 6. 24K audit adjustment

- VII. Executive Committee Jeff Feldt
 - A. Update
 - 1. Legal action taken against OrgPix, Inc d/b/a LIVEALITY for mobile application
 - a. Trying to recoup funds
 - b. March 5, 2024 is the cut-off date for a response from OrgPix
 - i. No response as of today
 - 2. Heart of the Valley Metorpolitan Sewerage District (HOVMSD) project: Interceptor System Rehabilitation
 - a. Scott Schramm from HOVMSD gave an informational presentation for this project
 - i. Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)was reviewed/discussed
 - 1. DOA attorneys reviewed, no comments
 - 1. DOA approved MOU to be endorsed
 - 2. Includes detail about restoration
 - 3. Photo and drone documentation will be taken throughout the project



- ii. McMullen & Pitz are the primary contractor
- iii. Work to begin first part of April, 2024
- 3. Kaukauna Lock 5 property ownership question
 - a. Friends of the Fox (FOF) purchased property on FRNSA's behalf
 - i. Part of a DNR Grant Program
 - 1. FOF could apply, FRNSA could not
 - b. FRNSA paid the 2012 taxes
 - i. There is now a special assessment on the property
 - ii. Concerns about who will be responsible for cleanup of property
 - c. Phil Ramlet has talked to the Department of Administration (DOA)
 - i. Need to determine who should own this property, FRNSA or State of Wisconsin
 - 1. DOA will talk about internally
 - d. Phil Ramlet checked the Register of Deeds website
 - i. FOF listed as owner
 - ii. Recommended that Phil Ramlet do a title search as the websites can be inaccurate and are used only as a guide

VIII. Fundraising Committee – John Vette

- A. Mary Schmidt Presentation
 - 1. In March 2024, FRNSA will start asking people for donations
 - a. Targeted effort is to fund our "Preservation Fund" to keep FRNSA in existence
 - i. Mary Schmidt will send out a packet to board with key speaking points
 - ii. The following members will start to ask for donations: Jeff Feldt, Ron Van De Hey, Tim Short and Phil Ramlet
 - 2. Will start with the Greater Green Bay Community Foundation and the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation
 - 3. Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region (CFFVR) is acting as FRNSA's fiscal agent so donations can be tax deductible
 - a. Donation button on both the CFFVR and FRNSA websites
 - 4. FRNSA and Schmidt Communicates will do a follow up at the June 2024 board meeting to see where we're at with fundraising and who has been contacted

 - A. Discuss
 - 1. (2) Buildings in need of repair
 - a. Bruce Enke will get the photos to Daina Penkiunas
 - b. Added to the 2025 Fiscal Year CIP Program
 - i. CIP list will be available at the March Board meeting

 - A. Bruce Enke asked if the UWGB 2023 monitoring proposal is a draft only or a final proposal
 - 1. Phil Ramlet is unsure, will check on this concern
 - B. Jeff Feldt approached by member of public regarding FRNSA's light bulb usage and electrical costs
 - 1. Ron Van De Hey stated this would be a great project for Jeremy Cords to follow up on
 - 2. Beth Taubel inquired about a "due" date as we are busy getting ready for our navigational season (paperwork, maintenance, interviews, etc)
 - a. No rush per Jeff Feldt
 - C. Steve Erb with AYC inquired about Sturgeons for Tomorrow in regards to having the sturgeon listed as an endangered species
 - 1. Phil Ramlet advised Steve Erb that concerned citizens should follow up with Senator Glenn Grothman's office
