  - a. Discussion
    - i. Items carried over from previous meeting for follow-up and to verify completion of tasks:
      - 1. Follow up on \$500 towards matching funds Kayak Portage Grant
        - a. Who donated these funds
          - i. Funds donated by the Dan and Lynn Kobussen via the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region (CFFVR)
            - 1. FRNSA has not sent a "thank you" to the Kobussen's; however, Phil Ramlet stated that CFFVR would take care
        - b. Funds put in "Preservation" account not deposited into Associated Bank "Portage Grant" account
          - i. How will FRNSA access funds when costs are incurred for portages
            - 1. Phil Ramlet is continuing to work on this issue

    - a. Rehabilitation due to aggressive corrosion
    - b. Two-year construction project
      - i. Protective lining in pipes
      - ii. Epoxy in concrete structures
    - c. Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)
      - i. DOA completed review
        - 1. Included in MOU
      - ii. No changes to leases or easements
      - iii. State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) approval received by HOVMSD
      - iv. Tim Bolwerk with Westwood reviewed plans on behalf of FRNSA
      - v. FRNSA will be listed as "additional insured"
    - d. Subcontractors
      - i. Visu-Sewer, Inc.
      - ii. McMullen and Pitz Construction Company
      - iii. Dave Tenor Excavating
    - e. Anticipated "kick-off"
      - i. March 27, 2024, pre-construction conference begins
      - ii. Target completion date is October 2025

      - ii. Work relies on the proper weather as the materials used are temperature sensitive

    - g. Work documentation
      - i. Photo documentation

    - h. FRNSA is most concerned with restoration
  - 2. Motion to Approve
    - a. Tim Short motions to approve and endorse the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), seconded by Ron Van De Hev
- ii. Kaukauna Lock 5 Property-Friends of the Fox (FOF)

## 1. Discuss

- a. 2011 FOF used a Stewardship Grant to acquire two parcels of property and then donate parcels to FRNSA
  - i. FRNSA unable to own property at that time
  - ii. Paperwork submitted to Madison
  - iii. Warranty deed never signed or recorded
    - Phil Ramlet will contact Register of Deeds to see who is listed as the owner
  - iv. FRNSA paid the 2012 property taxes
  - v. FRNSA philosophy was to acquire "assets"
- b. Property is located at Kaukauna Lock 5 on both sides of the driveway
  - i. Not an access point
  - ii. No known use for this property
  - iii. Phil Ramlet will point out to Executive Members after the meeting, prior to lunch
- c. Westwood completed mapping of all FRNSA property in 2020
  - i. These two parcels are not included in that mapping
- d. Ron Van De Hey states that FRNSA has a moral obligation to take property
  - i. FRNSA would prefer State of Wisconsin be listed as owner
  - ii. Phil Ramlet states that Westwood will need to be involved
  - Special assessment in the amount of \$119 for paving and sanitary sewer in roadway of those parcels is due
  - iv. Bruce Enke questions why/if FRNSA wants to take on the liability of this property
- e. Environmental contamination
  - i. Fuel oil leak on property
    - 1. Unsure if this issue has been remediated
    - 2. Phil Ramlet will check with the WIDNR to see if there is a "closeout" on these parcels
      - a. IF done, Phil Ramlet will get a copy of the environmental paperwork
- 3. Additional comments and concerns
  - a. Grant money available from WIDNR
    - Phil Ramlet and Mary Schmidt were going to follow up on this WIDNR grant
      - Bruce Enke inquired as to where they were at in this process, Jean Romback-Bartels had sent an email to Phil Ramlet and Bruce Enke regarding this grant
        - a. Phil Ramlet stated he had not seen/received the email
          - i. Phil Ramlet will double check his emails
          - ii. Bruce Enke will check his email and forward email on to Phil Ramlet
  - b. Local funds program available via Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WIDOT)
    - i. Verbiage in the 2028-2029 grant cycle would enable FRNSA to apply

- 1. Phil Ramlet will follow up with Tom Buchholz (WIDOT)
- c. Menasha Lock
  - FRNSA needs to decide what they are going to do regarding the Menasha Lock
    - 1. Approximately \$550K already spent
    - 2. No additional funds should be spent without an in-depth conversation by the Board of Directors
      - a. Requested this item be put on the Board of Directors February meeting agenda
    - 3. Current Kleinschmidt proposal has been routed to Ashley Dooley (WIDNR) for review
      - a. Ashly Dooley has requested additional time to review
    - 4. FRNSA needs to consider if Menasha Lock will be opened once goby is found in Lake Winnebago
      - a. Government canal is putrid
        - i. Utilizing the lock would be part of the solution to the smell
    - 5. FRNSA locks system is limited due to the closure of Menasha Lock and Rapide Croche Lock
      - a. FRNSA doesn't anticipate Rapide Croche Lock ever being opened
